

Fire Engine Restoration Project

Brief History

In 1937, Pinehurst purchased its second motorized fire engine from the Seagrave Company located in Columbus, Ohio. Engine 1 proudly served the community from October 1937 until May 1973. Upon its being sold, a local farmer purchased the truck because of its pumping capacity for irrigation use on his farm. In 1981, through an arrangement with an antique dealer, the farmer sold the truck to a collector in Landis, NC where it remained garaged until returning to Pinehurst on March 24, 2010.



The estimated total cost to restore the truck to showroom condition is \$25,000 and includes:

- \$15,000 Paint and minor bodywork
- \$3,000 Gold leaf lettering and striping per factory specifications
- \$2,000 Mechanical repairs, chrome
- \$5,000 Replacement equipment per factory specifications and contingency (ladders, nozzles, extinguishers...)



Pinehurst Fire Department—The Beginning

The Pinehurst Fire Department dates back to the start of the resort Village at the turn of the 20th century. In 1904, a volunteer department was formed and called Hose Company Number 1 and consisted of hand drawn hose carts which were housed in the Resort laundry building.

In 1930, the Department moved to its first designated location to centralize fire suppression equipment and remained in that location until 2007 when a new headquarters was constructed in the Village Government Complex on Magnolia Rd. The original fire equipment included a 1925 American-LaFrance Brockway Torpedo Triple Combination, Pumper, Chemical and hose Motor Car (the first motorized apparatus).
